Option 1: Federal Student Grants and Loans

Go to studentaid.gov

- If you have an account, log in
- If not, create one

Parents of dependent students must do this too!

Complete the free 2022-2023 FASFA

- Make sure to have your 2020 taxes and SSN
- Great Oaks federal student code is 014694

Look for an emailed financial aid offer

- Read and sign all 4 pages
- Return to the Financial Aid Office
- Submit other online, required forms
 - Master Promissory Note
 - Entrance Counseling
 - Annual Student Loan Acknowledgement

Balance is due at least one month before class starts
